Cynthia E. Rolfe is the author of her own creative spirit. Cynthia fosters personal growth in others as a caring coach, fabulous facilitator, workshop wizard, successful strategist, and energetic entrepreneur. Having earned a Ph.D. in Metaphysics from the American Institute of Holistic Theology and an Ed.D. in Administrative Services (Information Technology) and Business Education from Oklahoma State University, Cynthia easily traverses life through a focused yet natural approach to achieving contentment. She developed the Seven Wheels Model for Balanced Living – a seven-facet framework that provides insights to one's various life environments.

Professor Wilson has been a faculty member in OSU's Spears School of Business for 28 years, presently serving as Chair of the Management Science and Information Systems Department (a position he has held for 16 years).
